

Moulton Community Speedwatch – March 2026

I am pleased to say that we now have two new members, thanks Richard and Maria! This will certainly help us with our checks which we hope to increase especially as we are heading towards better weather and longer days.

Recently all our sites have been reviewed by the Police and the site on the grass by the school was deemed unsuitable. I raised this with the Police and am pleased that they agreed to meet me and discuss the reasons. We have agreed on an alternative position across the road by the school car part pedestrian entrance which gives us a good view of all roads which is a good outcome.

It was also confirmed that we can log speeding vehicles travelling away from us (as long as we can get the number plate!) which is useful as we sometimes have vehicles deliberately speeding away from us.

The new site at the school drive through exit proved encouraging as significant vehicle speeds were logged leaving the village past the school. This ties in with the VAS data we see for the site.

It was also encouraging that the local community police officer had a word with us and is pleased to join us on some of our checks.

VAS data shows similar trends to previously obviously with significantly reduced traffic volumes on Newmarket Road during the closure. Disappointingly though there are a significant number of vehicles still speeding when the road was partially open.

As ever we are still looking for more members as there is no change to the rule of having three people on a check which can be difficult to arrange.
